

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Fred Henry MacIntosh was born the son of George Earl and Clara Louise MacIntosh on May 28, 1913, in Wakefield, Massachusetts. He graduated from Wakefield High School in 1931, graduated from the University of South Carolina in 1936, and in 1941 received the M.A. degree from Duke University. In 1939 he married Elizabeth Burford Tate and now has two sons, Alexander Tate (8) and Victor Henry (6).

He taught English and history at Dreher High School in Columbia, South Carolina, and was appointed instructor of English at Clemson College in 1941. In 1945 he was advanced to the rank of assistant professor and in 1947 to that of associate professor. In 1950 he was Visiting Instructor in English at Duke University.

He has had two papers on programs of the South Atlantic Modern Language Association and is also ^a member of the Modern Language Association of America.
